Hometown Heroes Banner Dedication on Montgomery County Courthouse Plaza *Monday, November 12, 2018 at 10 a.m.*

Norristown, PA (November 7, 2018) – The Montgomery County Commissioners and the Gold Star Families will join the family of Marine Capt. Samuel Schultz to dedicate a Hometown Hero banner in his honor on the Montgomery County Courthouse Plaza at 10 a.m. on Monday, November 12th, the Veterans Day holiday

Capt. Schultz, 28, grew up in Huntingdon Valley and graduated from Abington Senior High School. He enrolled in the Navy ROTC program at Penn State and joined the Marine Corps after graduating.

Capt. Schultz was one of four Marines killed in a military helicopter crash during a training exercise on April 3rd in Southern California. He is the 18th U.S. service member from Montgomery County who have lost their lives in service to our country since September 11, 2001, to receive a Hometown Heroes banner.
