Montgomery County Reports 93 New COVID-19 Cases and Five Deaths *A Total Number of 3474 Cases and 194 Deaths Have Been Reported*

Norristown, PA (April 25, 2020) – Montgomery County officials and the Office of Public Health (OPH) today reported 93 additional individuals who tested positive and five individuals who died of COVID-19 bringing the countywide total to 3474 cases and 194 deaths.

“We continue to report a steady number of individuals testing positive for COVID-19, which reinforces the continued need to stay at home except for essential work and essential errands,” said Dr. Valerie A. Arkoosh, Chair, Montgomery County Board of Commissioners. “I am also saddened to report the deaths of five individuals.”

Of the five individuals who died of COVID-19, three had been hospitalized, two resided in long-term care facilities, and their ages ranged from 40-years-old to 90-years-old. Of those individuals, two were female and three were male.

The 93 positive individuals are from 27 municipalities. Sixty-one municipalities have been affected. A breakdown of today’s reported cases follows:
