Perspective:

Montgomery County's Unemployment Rate increased by .2% to 4.0% and remains the Workforce Development Area with the 3rd lowest rate in the Commonwealth behind Chester County (3.7%) and Lancaster County (3.7%). The Unemployment Rate increased by .1% in Pennsylvania to 4.7% and the national level remained steady at 4.1% for the 3rd month in a row.

Cristal was referred to the Montgomery County Employment, Advancement and Retention Network (EARN) program after moving from Virginia with her young daughter.
