Perspective:

Montgomery County's Unemployment Rate increased by .2% to 4.0% and remains the Workforce Development Area with the 3rd lowest rate in the Commonwealth behind Chester County (3.7%) and Lancaster County (3.7%). The Unemployment Rate increased by .1% in Pennsylvania to 4.7% and the national level remained steady at 4.1% for the 3rd month in a row.

Success Stories:

Cristal was referred to the Montgomery County Employment, Advancement and Retention Network (EARN) program after moving from Virginia with her young daughter. Cristal was discouraged about moving to an area where she did not have a network of friends and family but also excited at the prospect of starting fresh. She made a decision at enrollment that she was going to give the program a chance and fully commit to the goals she established with her Career Coach. Cristal was very active and engaged in each workshop and devoted in her personal job search. After expressing a desire to work in the banking and finance industry, her Career Coach set up an appointment for her with a member of the Business Services Team at the PA CareerLink® Montgomery County. After reviewing her resume, it was determined that she would be a good fit for an open position as a bank teller and an interview was scheduled. Cristal used the interviewing tools that she learned during a workshop and landed a full-time job as a bank teller for TD Bank in King of Prussia earning \$14.00 per hour with benefits. Despite her initial fear of the unknown, Cristal's dedication to the process paid off and feels like she made a beneficial career choice for her family.
